About 500 people came to the wedding party held in a large hall. The day of the wedding party I was with my sister. We went to the salon at 3 pm. She had a manicure and henna designs put on her hands. At about 7:30 she got her make-up and a dresser arrived to put on her white

Kaftan. Then, her husband came in the car to take her to the party. They arrived about 10:30 pm. The guests had come at 8 pm.

There was a band, with a singer, playing wedding songs and also a DJ for breaks, dinner, and when she changed her dress. Every hour she put on a different dress and took pictures with the people there. She came in a white dress, the next dress was purple. For dinner time the dress was red.
